I am writing to confirm that the South Eastern Health & Social Care Trust (the Trust) has now completed its search for information relating to above which you requested on 9 June 2025.

A response to each of the questions raised has been provided by the Adult Services & Prison Healthcare, Finance & Estates and Unscheduled Care, Medicine & Cancer Services Directorates and is attached in Appendix A.

It is important to note that if you refer any matter to the Information Commissioner, you will need to show evidence of having gone through the Trust's internal review procedure to try to resolve the matter with the Trust in the first instance.

A1a,b. The information requested is not held on a central information system. To obtain this information would require a manual review of records.
