**Freedom of Information Act 2000
Information in relation to replacement household appliances for homes in
which children are deemed to be at risk**

I am writing to confirm that the South Eastern Health & Social Care Trust (the Trust) has now completed its search for information relating to the above which you requested on 31 August 2018.

A response to each of the questions raised has been provided by the Finance and Estates Directorate and is attached in Appendix A.

If you are unhappy as to how this request has been handled, you have the right to seek a review within the Trust in the first instance. It is important to note that if you refer any matter to the Information Commissioner, you will need to show evidence of having gone through the Trust's internal review procedure to try to resolve the matter with the Trust in the first instance.

In the three years between July 2015 and July 2018 how much money has been authorised for replacement white goods/household appliances for homes in which children are deemed to be at risk?

The information requested is not held on a central information system. To obtain this information would require a manual review of records.

This would exceed the 'Appropriate Limit' as defined by the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trust therefore exempts the release of this information under Section 12(1).

12.-(1) Section 1(1) does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit.

In accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 this letter acts as a Refusal Notice.

However we can confirm that the following expenditure was incurred on furniture and fittings, which would incorporate expenditure on replacement white goods/household appliances:

July 2015 to June 2016	£56,986
July 2016 to June 2017	£55,202
July 2017 to June 2018	£80,056

The above values do not specifically relate to replacement white goods/household items but will also include new purchases, some soft furnishings and also furniture and fittings for Trust Staff.

The majority of the expenditure above was incurred within Children's Residential Homes & the Regional Secure Children's facility.

If you were to supply a list of electrical retailers the Trust could interrogate the finance system to determine how much has been procured from them. However this information would only be possible for the Trust as a whole and not specifically for children deemed to be at risk.
