I am writing to confirm that the South Eastern Health & Social Care Trust (the Trust) has now completed its search for information relating to the above which you requested on 17 April 2019.

A response to Questions 2, 3 and 4 was provided to you on 20 May 2019 and a response to Question 1 has been now provided by the Adult Services and Prison Healthcare Directorate which is attached in Appendix A.

Appendix A

I am writing to make an open government request information to which I am entitled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. I am part of a team conducting a NIHR funded research study (see details at the end of this letter) looking to map all of the LGBTQ+ specific mental health services for young people aged 12 – 25 years. We are interested in finding out information about any early intervention services, especially CAMHS and EIS that provide specialist LGBTQ+ mental health support. Please could you provide answers to the following questions:

Q1. Does your trust provide a specific mental health service for LGBTQ+ young people? (for example: specific LGBTQ+ group within a wider service, or an employee whose job is wholly or partly to provide specifically for LGBTQ+ young people). If yes: who would be the best person to contact about this service (name / email)?

A1. The Trust has not yet developed any specific services for the LGBTQ+ community and we have not received any resources for investment in specialist LGBTQ+ provision.
