Please can this data be broken down by age and reason for referral, if available? Please can this include referrals made as part of both routine child health visiting reviews and any ad-hoc referrals outside of routine health visiting reviews.**
- Q2. The number of referrals to speech and language therapy made by health visitors as part of the two and a half year health review for children in 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023.**
- Q3. The total number of children whose speech, language and communication was recorded as observed as a part of two and half year review for children in 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023.**
- Q4. The number of referrals to speech and language therapy made by health visitors as part of the four-year review for children in 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023.**

- Q5. The number of referrals to speech and language therapy made by school nurses as part of the primary one health review for children in 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023.**

- A5. The information requested is not held on a central information system. To obtain this information would require a manual review of records.
