Q1. I am undertaking a research study into the shape and content of endof-life care guidance for patients withdrawing from non-invasive ventilation (NIV) or continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP). Many Trusts have created such guidelines to support frontline staff in this tricky area of care. Please may I request a copy of your relevant guidelines under FOI?

A1. Whilst the Trust has clinical guidelines/procedure relating to supported ventilation, it does not include any specific detail in relation to end of life/withdrawal of treatment. This decision would be made on a case by case basis, in discussion with the patient/family and reflective of the individual's clinical presentation.
