- to an adult or child who has a disability or illness or
- someone who may be frail due to old age

Carers can be people of all ages including children, young people and parent carers of children with a disability or special needs.

Carers can help out in a number of practical ways, such as assisting someone with dressing, bathing, medication and transport. Some carers help by watching over someone to make sure they are safe.

How we will use your information

- We will link you into local Trust and carer support services

- If at any time you no longer wish to part of the Carers Information List please contact your local Carer worker and they will remove your name from their list
